Hello Fourth Grade Families! There are three fun filled weeks until we disperse for winter break. I cannot believe we have thirteen weeks under our belts.

In social studies, we will wrap up our Colonization of Early Pennsylvania unit while learning all about William Penn and indentured servants. We will then begin our next science unit, Ecosystems. We will learn about food chains, food webs, producers, consumers, decomposers, wetlands, and the water cycle.

In mathematics, we will begin our division unit. Students will learn how to divide up to four digit dividends by one digit divisors. Their answers will also include remainders.

In language arts, students will learn all about text features. We will explore captions, bullets, sidebars, diagrams, maps, charts, graphs, timelines, glossaries, and different tables on contents.
