Fourth Grade Families, we have six full weeks left in the third marking period! Despite the wacky weather, I am looking forward to all the exciting and fun virtual assemblies and projects we have planned in the month of March. March 13<sup>th</sup> also marks one year since we were sent home due to the devastating pandemic.

In social studies, we will continue our Historical People, Places and Events Unit. Students will learn about the French and Indian War, Declaration of Independence, the Liberty Bell, Betsy Ross, Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, and the First Continental Congress.
