Welcome!

Hello Fourth Grade Families! The first marking period will officially conclude in four days. I look forward to "zooming" with each of you during parent teacher conference week. We have much to celebrate!

During social studies, students will complete their geography unit. We learned all about regions, map features, major cities, physical features, natural resources, the importance of the Mason Dixon Line, historical places, landforms, population density, and the states bordering Pennsylvania. We will begin our new unit, Colonization of Early Pennsylvania. We will explore topics such as Native American tribes, William Penn, and indentured servants.

In mathematics, students will study all about multiplication and division. We will first learn all about factors, multiples, prime and composite numbers, and learn how to multiply two digit by two digit numbers.

In language arts, students will begin their next grammar unit. We will learn all about progressive verb tenses and then compose an expository essay. Students will write about three things they value most in life and provide details explaining the important of each topic.
